



ECHOES

ECHOES is the first European online survey of community health workers (CHW) who provide sexual health support in a community setting directly to gay, bisexual and other MSM.

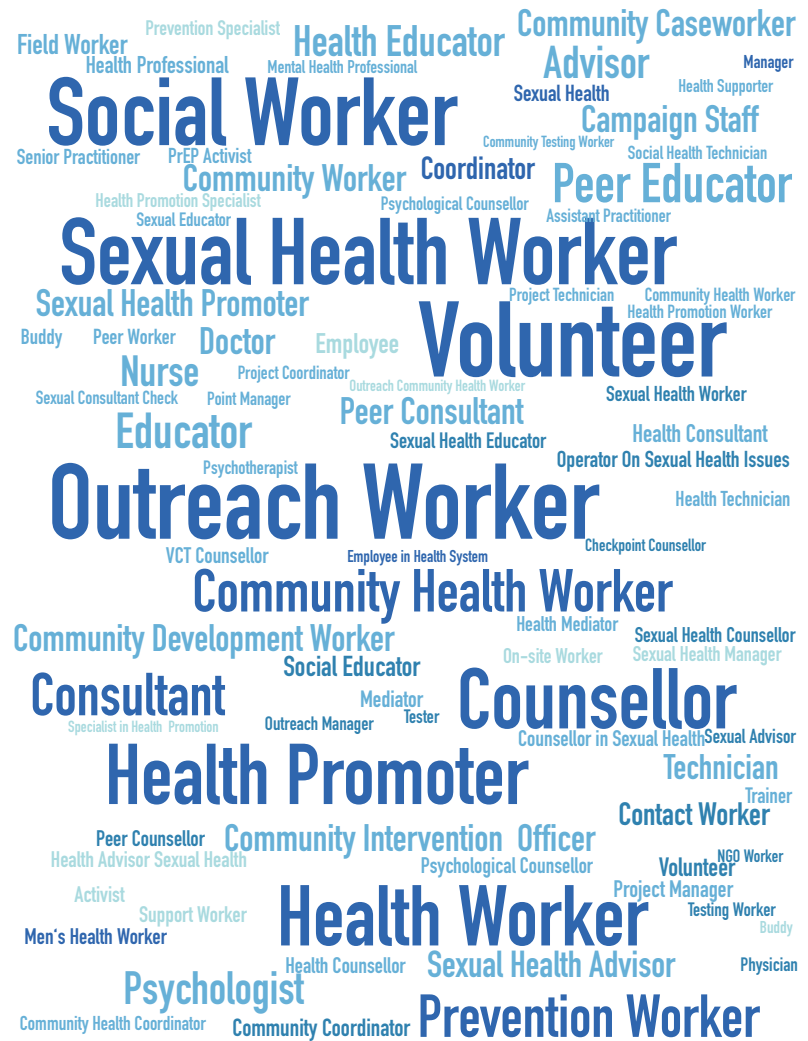
ECHOES

was conducted in 36 countries in Europe (EU and non-EU countries) between October 2017 and January 2018. 1035 participants took part.

Many of you support the health of men who have sex with men and the gay community by delivering a great variety of services like outreach work, testing services, mental health services etc. In ECHOES for the first time in Europe they all are addressed as 'Community Health Worker'.

However, many people in the field do not use this term. Graph 4 shows the variety of ways ECHOES participants name their job. This demonstrates the very wide range of people and professions that provide sexual health services to gay, bisexual and other men that have sex with men.
